## Transcription of the Will of Jeremiah Anderson (excerpt) August 21, 1788 Stamford CT Probate Record, Book II 1790-1799

"...It is my will and pleasure also that my Negro man Sim shall immediately after my death be perfectly free and at his own Liberty to act and do for himself and furthermore that the said Negro Man shall have seven pounds paid to him yearly after my death by William Anderson, son of my brother William Anderson, and upon failure of his paying said sum unto s[ai]d Negro man that then my Executor shall lease destrain or sell a sufficient quantity of land off the North part of s[ai]d Andersons land to pay the above mentioned seven pounds...."
